1- **Academic Search engines** "that give users control over their results. Instead of personalizing the results, they allow users to state preferences for certain types of

results explicitly. This approach should not be confused with taking control of the results returned by formulating complex queries or using advanced search interfaces. In addition, commercial advertisements do not appear during the search, and they also maintain user's privacy of these engines because they do not keep the user's data, nor the results of his (or her) research; nor do they give this data to marketers. Moreover, these engines use artificial intelligence, and have their own databases_ thus give their users different search results than the usual search engines"¹.
